Winter Cauliflower

This year, our Humboldt-Del Norte Specialty Crops Advisor <u>Eddie Tanner</u> partnered with three local farms to evaluate a new crop for the region... Winter Cauliflower! Wait, cauliflower? What's new about that?

Well, there are many types of cauliflower, but most of them do not produce a harvest in late winter or early spring. A harvest during these months would hit the market when farmgate prices are high and when the supply of local produce is at its lowest.

This trial evaluates three varieties of 'winter cauliflower' that are late-summer or fall planted but don't produce a head until March or April.

They were each planted at three in-row

spacings and will be evaluated for both the timing of harvest and marketable yields. At two of the sites, the plantings were replicated at a 2nd planting date to determine if plants that are larger going into winter will produce a larger harvest come spring.

If results look good, you'll soon be seeing more fields full of large bright green leaves... Get your cauliflower recipes ready!
