Bioenergy is an important local, renewable energy resource for the North Coast that promotes healthy, fire resilient forests and communities. Over the last year, UCCE's Forest Advisor Yana Valachovic, together with Assembly Member Jim Wood and others, contributed to the development of legislation for small bioenergy facilities, and this week, AB 1923 (Wood) passed the legislature and now waits for approval by Governor Brown. Humboldt County has three bioenergy facilities that are an essential part of local economies and infrastructure, providing many living wage jobs. If bioenergy is new to you, click here to visit UCCE's website to learn more about how woody biomass, like non-merchantable materials created from thinning forests and the byproducts (chips and bark) produced by sawmills,

demographics, land ownership, and the regional economy, there is great interest in forest sustainability, restoration, ecology, and new silvicultural strategies. It is critical that policies and strategies guiding use and management within the redwood region be reviewed and updated based on scientific information.
