(this includes paying for their Livescan/background check/fees) Implementing the next phase of their plan, 1st year members only pay \$5! Volunteers and 1st year members may choose to pay their county and state enrollment fees that will then be used for the yearly fee waiver program.

- 2. Have completed at least one year in 4-H


