These adults are screened, trained and supported to work with youth in a safe and inclusive environment. 4-H adult volunteers bring their expertise and interests to lead projects and activities and extend the research-based experiential learning to youth's interests and curiosities. Volunteers receive trainings to equip them with the resources, support and tools to guide youth in attaining their full potential. UC curricula are available for over 50 hands-on projects ranging from archery to animal husbandry to gardening. This year their combined efforts resulted in 4000 hours of
