


Farm to School KHSU Radio Show

Coming this December is the 2017 [Census of Agriculture](#).

This census is the only complete count of U.S. farms and ranches and the people who operate them. Census data are used to shape farm policies and programs and to help make decisions about the future of farming operations.

Are you a young farmer, beginning farmer, or a farmer who has never participated in the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Census of Agriculture before? Organic farmers, farmers that sell directly to consumers, urban farmers, and beginning and socially disadvantaged farmers are all typically under-counted in USDA's census. By participating in this annual process you can ensure that your farm is counted, thereby strengthening the USDA programs and policies that
